

C-44 Stormwater Treatment Area *Future Public Use for Recreational Activities*

On May 9, 2024, the SFWMD Governing Board Officially Declared This Area as a Stormwater Treatment Area



The South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) completed design plans for a public parking trailhead which includes a stabilized parking area with ADA access, interpretive kiosks, shelters, benches, restrooms, and signage.





Audubon-led birding tours will also likely be conducted. Birdwatchers may be able to spot sandhill cranes, snail kites, great blue herons, great egrets, mottled ducks and black-bellied whistling ducks,

along with roseate spoonbills, white pelicans, wood storks, and migratory shorebirds.





This area will soon be open for regularly scheduled public access and nature-based recreation that is compatible with the goals of the project. Activities will likely include hiking, bicycling, wildlife viewing, and photography.



Hours: Sunrise to Sunset Friday through Monday except during hunting season (September to November 15).
