This peer-reviewed, three-volume report provides the science and data used to drive decisions at the South Florida Water Management District. The report also documents restoration, water quality, scientific and engineering accomplishments in the Kissimmee Basin, Lake Okeechobee, Everglades, and South Florida's coastal areas during the 2024 Water Year (WY).

The full report is available online and covers environmental information of WY 2024 (May 1, 2023–April 30, 2024) and budgetary information for the SFWMD Fiscal Year 2024 (October 1, 2023–September 30, 2024).
