Taylor Creek Lock Opens for Navigation into Lake Okeechobee

Okeechobee, **FL** – The South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) has opened the navigation lock at Taylor Creek (S-193) on the northern edge of Lake Okeechobee.

The lock, which allows boaters to navigate around flood control structures and into the lake, was closed to boat traffic in February in order to maintain canal water levels in the area during the recent record-breaking dry season.

The lock will remain in the open position with no lock tender until the lake elevation reaches 14 feet NGVD. At that time, the lock will again be closed to navigation until the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers completes installation of the manatee protection upgrade.

Lake Okeechobee's elevation stood at 13.56 feet NGVD on July 31.
