## SFWMD to Participate in International Coastal Cleanup Day

WHAT: In support of International Coastal Cleanup Day, Big Cypress Basin Field

Station, the local arm of the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD), is partnering with the Golden Gate Task Force to clean up the

Green Boulevard Canal.

Water management staff will be helping Task Force volunteers by collecting trash and debris in the water and along the canal's banks. The District will use a barge to transport the debris to a nearby dumpster.

The International Coastal Cleanup, sponsored by Ocean Conservancy, is the world's largest volunteer effort to help protect oceans and waterways. During the 2008 Cleanup, nearly 400,000 volunteers removed 6.8 million pounds of debris from 6,485 sites in 100 countries, 42 U.S. states and the District of Columbia.
