## SFWMD Lets the Carp Out

Hungry grass carp fish help clear flood control canals of invasive plants



WHAT:

As part of a committed nuisance aquatic vegetation management program, the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) is set to release nearly 21,000 grass carp to eat canal-clogging plants.

Though the carp are Arkansas fish-farm natives, they are far from dangerous exotic species such as the Burmese python that have invaded South Florida. These effective biological controls are sterile and do not breed. They can focus all their energies on eating hydrilla, a rapidly growing invasive plant that slows water flow and can clog structures in SFWMD canals that must be kept clear for flood control purposes.
