S-127 Navigation Lock to be Placed Back into Service

Lake Okeechobee lock will resume operation on January 25

Okeechobee, FL — The South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) will resume normal operation of the S-127 navigation lock on Lake Okeechobee in Buckhead Ridge beginning on Monday, January 25, at 5:30 a.m.

The navigation lock was taken out of service several months ago to protect the canal system in Buckhead Ridge during a dredging project in a Lake Okeechobee navigation channel. In addition, the District needed to make repairs to the hydraulic lift mechanism on the lock gates. Gate repairs have been complete for several weeks, and dredging in the Pearce Canal finished on Friday, January 22.
