L-40 Levee Closes Temporarily Starting Today to Improve Maintenance Access

Public hiking and biking access is scheduled to resume April 3

WHAT:

The South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) is improving the roadway on the L-40 levee in Palm Beach County to improve access for District maintenance vehicles. The levee will be closed to the public for the duration of the approximately six-week project.

The District's maintenance program is critical to ensuring the L-40 functions properly to preserve water in Water Conservation Area 1 and the Arthur R. Marshall Loxahatchee National Wildlife Refuge. The levee also protects homes, businesses and public lands in western Palm Beach County.

WHEN: February 22 – April 2

TIME: Closed until project completion

WHERE: Just north of Boynton Beach Boulevard to just south of West Atlantic
