

Guided Nature Walk Showcases Recreation on SFWMD Public Land DuPuis Management Area at the Martin/Palm Beach County line hosts hike

WHAT:

Enjoy a beautiful morning trek amid the flora and fauna of the pine flatwoods and the cypress swamp in the pristine DuPuis Management Area. DuPuis contains a portion of the Florida Trail, a network of more than 1,500 miles of foot paths for the public to enjoy the state's natural habitats.

The guided walk is another in a free Nature Lecture Series sponsored by the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) and Florida Atlantic University's Center for Environmental Studies at DuPuis.

The DuPuis Management Area is a 22,000-acre natural area open to public recreation throughout the year. The area was part of the historic Everglades and features an ecologically diverse and significant vegetative community.

The South Florida Water Management District is steadily increasing recreational access to public lands while continuing to manage them to support environmental restoration, water supply, water quality and flood control missions. At present, the District actively manages 621,000 acres of public land. Many of these properties are in their natural state or have enhancements such as picnic tables, informational kiosks, campsites and hiking trails.
