SFWMD Ends Burn Ban on Public Lands Open for Recreation

Campfires are now allowed because of recent rainfall

West Palm Beach, FL — Due to recent rainfall that has reduced wildfire danger, the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) is once again allowing the careful building of campfires in designated areas on certain District lands open for recreation.

The action follows the July 7 lifting of a similar ban on campfires in state forests by the Florida Division of Forestry.

While conditions have improved, regional water levels will need time and significant rainfall to recover from a record drought.

The SFWMD continues to ask residents and businesses to conserve water and follow landscape irrigation restrictions to stretch and protect the public water supply. For water saving tips, visit www.savewaterfl.com.
