SFWMD Offering Training for Prospective Florida Water Star Certifiers
Free two-day program is the first step toward becoming a certifier



WHAT:

The South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) is hosting its third free training session for prospective Florida Water Star residential certifiers. The two-day workshop will feature an overview of the water conservation program's three residential tiers — Gold, Silver and Bronze — along with hands-on field training in the Florida Water Star inspection process. A testing session will be offered immediately following the training on Friday, February 25, for participants who wish to attempt the Florida Water Star Residential Certifier exam.

Created by the St. Johns River Water Management District and now being implemented in both South and Southwest Florida, Florida Water Star is a points-based certification program encouraging water savings in homes by recognizing the use of water-efficient household appliances, plumbing fixtures, irrigation systems and landscapes.

The workshop is the first step toward becoming a Florida Water Star residential certifier. During the training session, prospective certifiers will learn about:

• The program criteria

• The role and responsibilities of the certifier

• The process for completing certifier training, including testing
