Public Conservation Lands Scare Up a Spooky Halloween Night DuPuis Management Area at the Martin/Palm Beach county line offers creepy critters, hayrides and free family fun



WHAT:

Visit the DuPuis Management Area for free ghostly fun on Haunted Halloween Night, a popular annual event complete with a family-friendly atmosphere, fun games, crafts and a hair-raising haunted house. An allages howling hayride through the woods will depart from the visitors' center before sunset.

Haunted Halloween Night at DuPuis will also feature creepy critters such as bats, owls, snakes and spiders. Boy Scout Troop #832 will be selling hot dogs, chips, apple cider and homemade doughnuts.

The DuPuis Management Area is a 22,000-acre natural area open to public recreation throughout the year. The area was part of the historic Everglades and features an ecologically diverse and significant vegetative community.

Throughout South Florida, the District provides recreational access to its public lands while continuing to manage them to support environmental restoration, water supply, water quality and flood control missions. At present, the District owns approximately 621,000 acres of land that are open to the public. Many of these properties are in their natural state or have enhancements such as picnic tables, informational kiosks, primitive campsites and hiking trails.
