## SFWMD Joins National Weather Service for Dry Season Outlook

Water levels remain above average in many areas of South Florida

**WHAT:** The South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) and the National

Weather Service (NWS) will hold their annual joint briefing about weather and water conditions for the upcoming dry season. With above average wet season rainfall and a record deluge from Tropical Storm Isaac, some South Florida communities received a year's worth of rainfall in six

months.
