SFWMD Releases First Draft Recommendations for Land Assessment Public invited to workshop to comment on recommendations for District lands in the Upper Lakes region

WHAT:

As part of its ongoing comprehensive land assessment, the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) today released draft staff recommendations for its fee-owned lands in the Upper Lakes region, which includes parts of Orange, Osceola and Polk counties. The draft recommendations are available for review on the District's land assessment website at www.sfwmd.gov/landassessment.

Stakeholders and the general public will have the opportunity to provide feedback on the draft recommendations at a workshop next week in St. Cloud. Public comments may also be submitted on the land assessment website through May 6. In addition, the draft recommendations will be presented at the May meeting of the Water Resources Advisory Commission (WRAC).

Final recommendations for the Upper Lakes region will be submitted to the full Governing Board at its May 9 meeting.

The purpose of the land assessment is to ensure that each parcel owned by the District supports the agency's core mission of balancing and improving flood control, water quality, natural systems and water supply. The first phase of the assessment is a review of 750,000 acres of fee-owned lands — properties in which the agency has full ownership rights. This phase is scheduled for completion by mid-2013 and will be followed by a comprehensive review of non-fee-owned lands.
