Big "O" Birding Extravaganza Registration Now Under Way

CLEWISTON, FL - Early registration is now under way for the Hendry/Glades County Big "O" Birding Extravaganza scheduled for April 3 – 6. What organizers envision as becoming the largest bird-themed event in South Central Florida, this year's extravaganza has grown into a three-day festival followed by a daylong eco-tourism seminar. Early registrants can take advantage of deep registration discounts between now and March 6.

"Our goal this year is to introduce birding enthusiasts to what this region has to offer," says festival committee chair Janet Papinaw. "We've received an incredible amount of regional support and hope to make the festival affordable to everyone."

An all-inclusive festival pass, if ordered by March 6, is only \$100.00. After March 6, the same pass is still only \$125.00. Proof of Hendry or Glades County residency will earn you an additional 10% discount regardless of when you register. While the all-inclusive pass EXCLUDES accommodations, it does afford the festivalgoer four full days of birding activities, scheduled meals and transportation to and from the guided tour sites.
