

Educational Everglades DVD Earns Communicator Award of Excellence Interactive DVD among winners chosen by International Academy of the Visual Arts

Fort Myers, FL — An interactive educational DVD created by the South Florida Water Management District's (SFWMD) Lower West Coast Service Center and Fort Myersbased Main Sail Video Productions recently received a 2010 Communicator Award of Excellence from the International Academy of the Visual Arts.

The Future of America's Everglades provides an interactive classroom experience that introduces students of all ages to the Everglades ecosystem and the efforts under way to restore it. The DVD features 24 video segments narrated by middle school drama students and accompanied by interactive quizzes and vocabulary lists. Each segment

gives viewers the opportunity to visit remote areas often accessible only by airboats or helicopters and meet the people doing the important work of Everglades restoration.

Now in its 16th year, the Communicator Awards is the largest and most competitive awards program honoring the creative excellence of communications professionals. The winners of the 2010 awards were chosen from more than 7,000 entries submitted from around the world. *The Future of America's Everglades* was recognized in the Interactive Multimedia – Children's Audience category.
