SFWMD Awards Funding for Nine Water Conservation Projects WaterSIP grants help save billions of gallons of water each year

West Palm Beach, FL — Recognizing the ongoing importance of promoting and supporting water conservation in protecting regional supplies, the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) Governing Board approved investments in nine projects for Fiscal Year 2012 through the agency's Water Savings Incentive Program (WaterSIP).

"We are committed to work with our partners to invest in cost-effective programs that help to protect water resources," said SFWMD Governing Board Chairman Joe Collins. "WaterSIP saves billions of gallons of water each year with innovative projects that also build an ethic of water conservation."

The District will contribute a combined total of \$250,000 in funding assistance to the following recipients:

Created in 2002, WaterSIP provides matching funds up to 50 percent or a maximum of \$50,000, whichever is less, to public and private water providers or to large users for implementing water-saving technologies.

From 2002 through 2011, the District's WaterSIP program has invested \$4.1 million in 142 projects throughout the agency's 16-county region. These projects now save an estimated 7 million gallons of water per day.
