# 2012 WATER WATCH

Keeping an Eye on Water Resources

### District-Wide Conditions for March 27, 2012

The South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) is issuing the following briefing:

Springtime is the height of the dry season in South Florida. Limited rainfall, an increase in temperature and higher evapotranspiration rates typically reduce water resources at a faster pace at this time of year.

Water supplies are at adequate levels, although the 16-county region remains in a below-average dry season. A drier-than-normal dry season is expected to continue with the waning effects of the La Niña weather pattern, indicating a potential return to water shortage conditions in the coming weeks. As a result, the region remains under a water shortage warning.

#### **Water Conservation Measures**

- South Florida is under the District's Year-Round Landscape Irrigation Rule that limits residential and business landscape irrigation to two or three days per week based on location.
  - Some city and county governments have adopted local ordinances that differ from the District rule and may further limit landscape irrigation. To determine watering

- days and times in your area, contact your local government or visit <a href="https://www.sfwmd.gov/2days">www.sfwmd.gov/2days</a>.
- o Note: Customers of the West Palm Beach and Lake Worth utilities remain under local orders that limit landscape irrigation to one day per week.
- Permitted water users such as nurseries, agriculture, golf courses and utilities are required to continue following the water use conditions in their permits.
